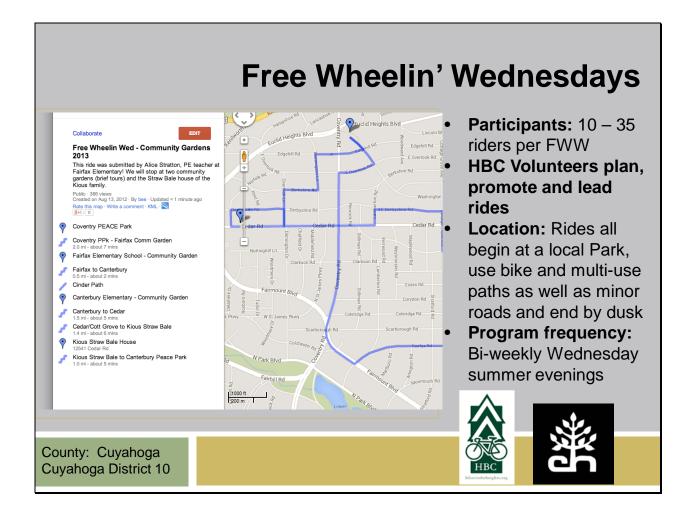

Free Wheelin' Wednesdays are Wednesday evening rides that showcase the region during the summer months. These social rides are open to all cyclists of all ages, with some rides geared specifically towards families. FWW rides all begin at the Coventry Peace Arch and finish by dusk. Riders are asked to wear helmets, have bikes in good working order and sign a liability waiver. Riders are encouraged to meet their neighbors and learn more about their community by bike!

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FWW rides are planned by a volunteer committee comprised of HBC Board members, HBC Education and Encouragement Committee members and anyone else who would like to join in planning, leading or joining a FWW ride that year. Google bicycle route mapping is used to finalize routes so that they can be posted online for continued use by community members.

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The goals of FWW are multi-faceted:

Provide free recreation to anyone with a bike and helmet – some riders feel most safe in a group Engage community members in learning about their community – there are historical rides, community garden ride tours, park tours, family-themed rides and pub crawls. Establish and showcase community bike routes that can be used repeatedly

**Great promotional tool for bike organizations



While FWW rides are promoted through email, on the organization's website and through articles in the local press, Facebook is also used to communicate ride reminders and cancellations—the social rides do not require registration and their spontaneous nature fits well with social media promotion



We found several resources to be key in organizing these rides:

Google Maps – using the biking icon allows planners to see recorded bike infrastructure such as bike paths and trails as well as bike lanes (this tool can also be used to SUBMIT paths and trails to Google)

Insurance – all HBC members and first-time FWW riders are covered for liability under a LAB general liability insurance policy; HBC is a LAB member

Membership Forms – social rides are a great way to gain momentum in cycling numbers; HBC always has membership forms available for FWW riders

2014 FWW Rides will be co-sponsored by a neighborhood business development group (Coventry Village Improvement District) that will also help organize vendor discounts and complimentary programming, such as a public screening of a bike-themed movie
