



Anita Brindza, executive director the Edgewater community development organization Cudell Improvement Inc. (http://www.cudell.com/), said she believed the Cleveland Metroparks' takeover of Edgewater Park from the state drove up the market.

"There has been a huge difference," Brindza said. "People (previously) saw Edgewater Park as a liability. It wasn't their first choice for recreation. Now, with the type of events the Metroparks are putting on, everyone can feel safe, the park is clean, and the events are well run."


Ample research from ULI and other sources points to strong market and consumer demand for places that support healthy behaviors. The survey-based research effort *America in 2013* identified strong market preferences for walkability, proximity to parks, and other wellness-related community features, with 76 percent of U.S. millennials saying walkability was an important community characteristic. Pedestrian-oriented communities with access to transit have been shown to garner higher rents and retail sales. Bicycle infrastructure can have an economic payoff, with homes located near bike paths commanding a 10 percent price premium.



outdoors, such as parks, trails, and beaches. These visitors spend \$733 million annually in the
local economy and generate \$50.5 million in state and local sales taxes (Table 6).





Financial Sustainability:


Establish a sustainable business/funding plan to support Cleveland Metroparks capital, operations, and maintenance needs.

Connecting Cleveland

In 2004, the City of Cleveland adopted the "Connecting Cleveland: Waterfront District Plan."

In that same year, ODOT and the Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) budgeted \$49.8 million (\$40 CO; \$5 RW; \$4.8 PE) to the West Shoreway/Lakefront West project, with construction originally planned for 2010.






